*The purpose of this Bylaw is to provide for the control of public places and reserves in Manukau City, to enable people to use and undertake activities within these places, while ensuring public health and safety is maintained, obstructions are managed, inappropriate behaviour is avoided, and damage and mis-use of Council controlled land, structures and infrastructure is prevented.*

*The Bylaw includes clauses on –*

*(a) naming streets, numbering houses and defacing names and numbers.*

*This Bylaw should be read in conjunction with the entire Manukau City Consolidated Bylaw 2008 and other regulations affecting public places not necessarily repeated within this Bylaw.*

## **1 Interpretation**

1.1 In this chapter, unless inconsistent with the context:

**PUBLIC PLACE** means a place that is owned by or under the control of the Manukau City Council and that is open to, or being used by, the public. It includes Council controlled reserves, parks, civic areas, beaches and roads (including footpaths and carriageways).

## **2. Exemptions**

2.1 Nothing in this bylaw limits the Council, its authorised officers or agents from undertaking works and services in public places, or restricts work authorised by the Council in public places.

## **3. Naming Streets, Numbering Houses and Defacing Names and Numbers**

3.1 In accordance with this clause:

- (a) Every owner or occupier of premises must:
  - (i) mark those premises with such numbers, being in no case less than 50 mm in height, as the Council shall direct or approve;
  - (ii) renew those numbers as and when they are obliterated or defaced, or as the Council directs; and
  - (iii) attach those numbers to the premises or to a post, fence, or gate or letter box on those premises as to be readily visible from the road.
- (b) The Council may alter the number of any premises where in its opinion it is necessary to do so.
- (c) No person may give a name to or affix, set up, or paint a name on a road, private road, or public place.
- (d) No person may wilfully or maliciously destroy, pull down, obliterate, or deface the name of a road, or the number of any premises.
