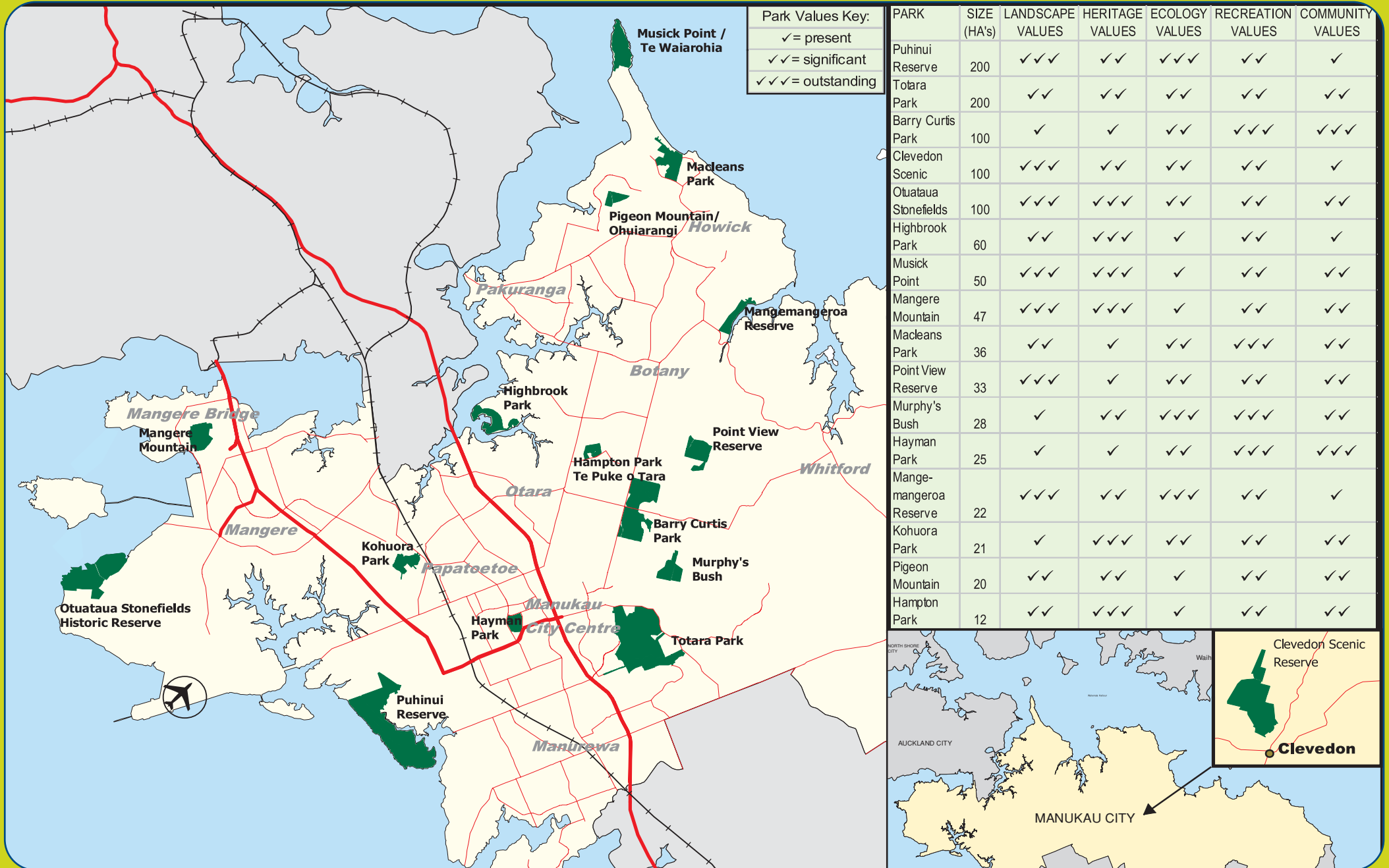

# Goal 1

Premier Parks

## Policy Statement

Council will recognise the importance of the City's premier parks by ensuring continued investment in development and management programmes that conserve and enhance their recreational, ecological, heritage, landscape and community values.

There are 16 premier parks, existing, planned or potential in Manukau. Premier parks are passive parks that have city-wide, regional or national significance. Although all our largest parks are included in this group, size is not the only defining factor (see table opposite).

1. Barry Curtis Park - a nationally renowned park in the heart of Flatbush (under development)
2. Clevedon Scenic Reserve - rural native bush rising above the Wairoa River
3. Hampton Park/Te Puke o Tara - a heritage oasis in the middle of the East Tamaki industrial area
4. Hayman Park - Manukau's City Centre park, vibrant, diverse, unique (subject to redevelopment)
5. Highbrook Park - an international standard business park on the Waiouru Peninsula (under development)
6. Kohuora Park - a park in a crater with restored wetlands and rare native plants
7. Macleans Park - a contrasting landscape of ridge tops, gullies and beach hinterland
8. Mangemangeroa Reserve - dramatic estuarine landscape at the edge of the urban area
9. Mangere Mountain - a volcanic icon of Manukau and its people
10. Murphy's Bush - a reminder of how Kahikatea bush once dominated the Manukau lowlands
11. Musick Point/Te Waiarohia - stunning views from some of the best preserved pohutukawa cliffs remaining in Auckland (subject to Treaty Settlement Claim)
12. Otuataua Stonefields Historic Reserve - a heritage landscape of national importance
13. Pigeon Mountain/Ohuiarangi - a 'castle and moat' volcano overlooking the Tamaki Estuary
14. Point View Reserve - the high point on the ridgeline that defines Manukau's urban/rural limits
15. Puhinui Reserve - countryside on the Manukau Harbour
16. Totara Park - countryside in the city.

## Actions

- 1.1 Ensure all premier parks have reserve management plans, development plans and long term funding strategies in place (\*priority project).
- 1.2 Take action in partnership with Tangata Whenua, to resolve the ownership and management issues surrounding Musick Point/Te Waiarohia to ensure that the land is protected and enjoyed in perpetuity as a public reserve.
- 1.3 Identify, through a review of the land acquisition programme, opportunities for Council to acquire more land of premier park status, including the purchase of additional land adjoining existing premier parks (\*priority project).
