



LIMITED EDITION RUGBY WORLD CUP BALLS GIVEN AWAY

Two Manukau residents are the latest recipients of limited edition balls being given away in the countdown to Rugby World Cup 2011.



One ball a month is being given away to Aucklanders in the build up to the world cup in September 2011. People who receive the balls become part of Team 2011 and will be involved in Auckland's opening festivities, as well as having a chance to win two tickets to the opening match of the cup.

Just before Christmas, Pakuranga United Rugby Club patron Barry Smith was presented with one of the balls by All Black legend Waka Nathan. On the same day the club found out it will host Scotland during the world cup.

Pakuranga United will host the team for five nights as they prepare for their game against England at Eden Park on Saturday 1 October. It means people living in the area will be able to see top quality players up close and get their autographs.

The council will provide \$200,000 to upgrade the playing surface of Bell Park, the rugby club grounds within Lloyd Elmore Park, and make other improvements needed for the park to be a training venue.

In January Mangere Bridge resident Di Clark was presented with a Team 2011 ball by former All Black captain Andy Dalton.

Di is a WiSE Guide volunteer, who greets visitors to Auckland as they come off cruise ships and tells them what they can see and do in the city.

Volunteers will play a vital role in welcoming the tens of thousands of visitors expected in Auckland during the tournament.

PUBLIC IDEAS INVITED FOR UXBRIDGE PRECINCT

The council is about to start a feasibility study into a proposal to redevelop the Uxbridge Precinct, which is made up of "Uxbridge, Howick's Creative Centre" (the Creative Centre), Keall House and the Howick Library.

The proposal is to redevelop the Creative Centre in 2012/13 and 2013/14, and at some later date to extend the Howick Library to provide more study space for students. Keall House might also have to be removed for more parking for the Creative Centre and the library.

But, before developing a master plan, the council wants to know what the community thinks about these proposals and what residents want regarding the design.

Two public workshops are being held on **16 February 2010** from 9am to 12 noon, and **17 February 2010** from 7pm to 9pm, both at The Gallery, Uxbridge, Howick's Creative Centre, 35 Uxbridge Road, Howick.

APARTMENT DESIGN GUIDE

A guide to help get good quality apartment buildings in Manukau is now available for feedback.

When complete the Residential Apartment Design Guide will establish a set of minimum criteria to direct the good design and development of residential apartment buildings in Manukau.

It will give useful guidance to developers when planning apartment buildings, as well as ensuring they are good quality and work for the people living in the building.

It will also be an important resource for council planners responsible for creating new plans relating to residential apartments and for assessing residential apartment development.

The draft apartment design guide sets out minimum sizes for apartments and guidelines to make sure they are well laid out. The proposed minimum sizes are: studio - 35sqm; one bedroom - 45sqm; two bedrooms - 70sqm; three bedrooms - 90sqm.

The design guide also includes recommendations for making sure apartments have privacy both inside and out for residents, building appearance guidelines and ensuring enough car parking is available.

NOTICE OF REQUIREMENT FOR A DESIGNATION

Notification of a Notice of Requirement under Sections 168 and 169 of the Resource Management Act 1991

Manukau City Council (MCC) has received a Notice of Requirement (NOR) for Designation from the Requiring Authority, Wiri Oil Services Limited (WOSL).

Location: The Wiri to Auckland Pipeline (WAP) proposed to be designated under this NOR begins from the WOSL terminal, at first it extends south along the eastern side of McLaughlins Road reserve for a distance of approximately 120m, then turns northwest under McLaughlins Road, covering approximately 20m and travels further northwest for some 220m under 69 McLaughlins Road, before crossing under the Puhinui Stream.

After crossing the stream, the WAP passes under 100 Prices Road with a small area of the designation extending over 102 Prices Road, a distance of approximately 610m as the WAP approaches Prices Road.

The pipeline then crosses under Prices Road covering a distance of approximately 20m, and then runs parallel to Prices Road but on MCC owned land, 87 Prices Road, for approximately 200m in a northern direction. The pipeline then extends northwest under 55 Prices Road and continues in that direction under 454 Puhinui Road for approximately 1275m until it reaches the northern side of Puhinui Road, where Puhinui Road intersects with Campana Road.

The WAP then extends southwest and runs parallel to Puhinui Road for approximately 520m to Orrs Road.

MCC Reference: Proposal No. 36647

Description of Requirement: The existing underground WAP route extends over a distance of approximately seven kilometres, between the WOSL terminal at 149 Roscommon Road and the Auckland International Airport. The purpose of the WAP is to transmit aviation fuel to the Airport.

This NOR is to designate a section of the existing WAP route, from WOSL to the point where Puhinui Road meets Orrs Road, but does not include any new pipelines or any additions to the existing pipeline.

The NOR documentation identifies that the primary objective of the requiring authority, in seeking the designation, is to ensure security of supply of jet fuel between the WOSL terminal and the Airport. This requires that:

· WOSL's interest in the land through and under which the WAP passes is clearly established independent from WOSL's present position as the WAP operator, and WOSL's interest in that land by virtue of and whilst sub lessee of the terminal land; and

- Information relating to the location and purpose of the pipeline is publicly accessible; and
- The WAP is protected from potentially conflicting activities; and
- Appropriate provision is made for the operation maintenance, repair, replacement and (limited) upgrading of the pipeline.
